# Iran Planned to Kill Israeli Envoy to Mexico this Year

(JNS) – Hasan Izadi, an Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps official in Iran,

planned to assassinate Einat Kranz Neiger, the Israeli ambassador to Mexico,

starting in late 2024 and kept the plot going actively through the first half of 2025, according to a U.S. official and the Israeli Foreign Affairs Ministry.

The official in the Quds Force, which resembles the CIA, previously worked at the Iranian Embassy in Venezuela, where he was second adviser. He used the alias Masood Rahnema.

The U.S. official said that Izadi targeted U.S. and Israeli officials and while he was in Venezuela, he communicated with Hezbollah, the Iranian proxy terror group in Lebanon.

“The plot was contained and does not pose a current threat,” said the U.S. official, who spoke anonymously. “This is just the latest in a long history of Iran’s global lethal targeting of diplomats, journalists, dissidents and anyone who disagrees with them.”

The revealed plot is “something that should deeply worry every country where there is an Iranian presence,” the official said.

The Israeli Foreign Affairs Ministry told JNS that “we thank the security and law enforcement services in Mexico for

thwarting a terrorist network directed by Iran that sought to attack Israel’s ambassador in Mexico.”

“The Israeli security and intelligence community will continue to work tirelessly, in full cooperation with security and intelligence agencies around the world, to thwart terrorist threats from Iran and its proxies against Israeli and Jewish targets worldwide,” the Israeli ministry said.

Izadi has traveled extensively in Latin America, where he operates a network of informants, JNS learned. While based in Caracas in 2021, Izadi and Hossein Kiani-Mordi, Iran’s military attaché, contacted dissidents from the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia to coordinate attacks throughout Latin America against senior U.S. and Israeli officials.

Per an in-app, Instagram translation of the post, the embassy stated that Madu-

# Christians Protest Amsterdam Venue’s Chanukah Boycott

(JNS) – Leaders of Dutch Christian Zionists protested last Thursday in Amsterdam against the Royal Concert Hall’s decision to cancel a Chanukah concert because it features a cantor who serves in Israel’s army.

Separately, France’s culture minister, Rachida Dati, condemned calls to boycott the Israel Philharmonic and prevent that orchestra from performing in Paris last Thursday at the seat of its local counterpart.

Dati tweeted “welcome” to the visiting orchestra, saying, “Nothing justifies boycotting culture right now,” and adding, “Antisemitism has no pretext.” It was a response to calls for a boycott by anti-Israel groups, whose activists police feared would try to disrupt the concert.

Regarding the boycott action in Amsterdam, Amichai Chikli, Israel’s minister for Diaspora affairs and combating antisemitism, last Tuesday wrote to Femke Halsema, the city’s mayor, asking her to condemn the Royal Concert Hall’s decision. “Silence now would be complicity,” Chikli warned her. Amsterdam, he added, “must not remain silent while its institutions single out Jews and contribute to the isolation of a small and already vulnerable community.”

Pieter van Oordt and his brother, Roger, two leaders of the Christians for Israel movement in the Netherlands, arrived at the Royal Concert Hall last Wednesday and Thursday with banners that recalled the institution’s firing of its Jewish staffers in 1941, to protest the current leadership’s decision to cancel the Channukah concert held there annually because of the Israeli cantor, Shai Abramson.

One banner read: “Royal Concert Hall: Jews banned in 1941, banned for Israeli Jews in 2025.” Another read: “Banned for Israeli Jews now, soon

banned for all Jews?”

Since Oct. 7, 2023, several Dutch venues have banned Jewish and Israeli speakers at events, including last month’s elections event organized by the Center for Information and Documentation in Israel, which is Dutch Jewry’s pro-Israel lobby group.

“The Royal Concert Hall’s boycott action stands out because of its cultural prominence. It’s a symbol,” Roger van Oordt, the previous director of Christians for Israel, told JNS.

He added that Christians for Israel is considering joining the legal action launched against the Royal Concert Hall by the Chanukah Concert Association, which organizes the annual celebration at the building.

Oscar Hammerstein, a prominent Dutch-Jewish jurist, has called on his countrymen to boycott the Royal Concert Hall unless it reverses its ban.

Hammerstein also presented on X a document he said shows that the grandfather of the current director of the Royal Concert Hall, Simon Reinink, was the official who on Nov. 23, 1940 signed an order that terminated the employment of a Jewish professor from Leiden University.

The fired professor was Eduard Maurits Meijers, the founding father of the current Dutch civil code, the Nieuw Burgerlijk Wetboek. The document presented by Hammerstein was signed by Hendrik Jan Reinink, then the secretary-general of the education ministry under German occupation, and Simon’s grandfather.

“Eighty-five years later, history repeats itself in chilling fashion: Once again, Jews are being excluded – this time not from the university, but from the Royal Concert Hall, the house of music, where they wished to celebrate Chanukah,” Hammerstein wrote. [HW](#)

ro “visited the residence of the Iranian Embassy in Caracas to pay tribute to the martyr president Raisi and his companions,” referring to the late Iranian president Ebrahim Raisi.

Izadi worked with Majid Dastjani Farahani and Mohammad Mahdi Khanpour Ardestani, JNS learned. Both of the latter are Iranian intelligence officers on the FBI “most wanted” list, and both are thought to have attempted to recruit people in the United States in their plots against U.S. government officials. # Texas Republican Introduces Bill Seeking to Revoke Tax-Exempt Status of Groups with Terror Ties

(JNS) – Legislation introduced in the House last Tuesday seeks to revoke the tax-exempt status of extremist groups

with close ties to terrorist organizations. “It is absurd that the U.S. has provided organizations with ties to terrorism tax-exempt status,” said Rep. Chip Roy (R-Texas), sponsor of the bill. Americans are “inadvertently subsidizing terror against themselves,” he added.

“No organization with ties to terrorism should receive a tax benefit,” he said, stating that organizations, such as the Council on American-Islamic Relations, should be immediately stripped of their nonprofit status.

“CAIR has ties with Hamas, the Muslim Brotherhood and other extremist organizations that routinely use violence and commit horrific acts to advance their political agenda,” Roy said. “CAIR’s national executive director even praised Hamas’s barbaric Oct. 7 attacks against Israel.” (CAIR, which has repeatedly denied allegations of terrorism ties, blamed Israel for being attacked on Oct. 7.)

The legislation has drawn support from several Republican lawmakers. If enacted, the measure would take effect for taxable years ending after the date of enactment.

Mark Levin, a Fox News host who is Jewish, commended the bill’s introduction, writing, “Great job, Chip Roy.” **HW**

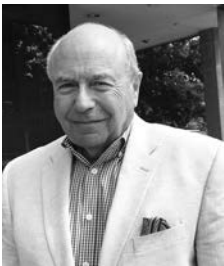

# Mayor-Elect Mamdani Condemns Swastika Spray-Painted on Jewish School

JNS) – While Jewish families across New York City were processing election results last Tuesday, vandals spray-painted multiple large red swastikas on the walls of Magen David Yeshivah, one of the largest Sephardic Jewish

schools in Brooklyn, N.Y. The New York Post reported that the suspect “wore all black” and “fled on foot.” “Brooklyn’s Jewish community wakes up to two swastikas at Magen

David Yeshivah in Gravesend,” representative Nicole Malliotakis (R-N.Y.) posted on social media, urging mayor-elect Zohran Mamdani to condemn the graffiti.

City and national figures, including Republican Councilwoman Inna Vernikov, the Combat Antisemitism Movement and Joel Petlin, superintendent of the Kiryas Joel School District in Upstate New York, also linked the vandalism to Mamdani’s victory.

“It’s probably not a coincidence that Magen David Yeshivah was attacked with a swastika on the night of the Mamdani election, after they required that all applicants to their school be registered to vote,” Petlin said.

Rep. Elise Stefanik (R-N.Y.) condemned the graffiti as “a wake-up call that Mamdani is ushering in the pro-terrorist antisemitic takeover of NYC aided and abetted by the worst governor in America.” She also called on both

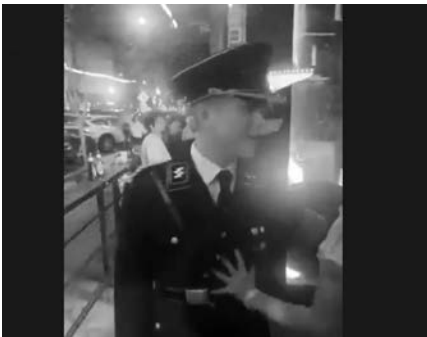
Mamdani and New York Gov. Kathy Hochul to respond.

After Hochul issued a statement calling the graffiti a “hateful display of antisemitism,” Stefanik fired back, writing that the governor should “get your endorsed Communist antisemite to condemn.”

By midday last Wednesday, Mamdani released his own statement: “This is a disgusting and heartbreaking act of antisemitism, and it has no place in our beautiful city. As mayor, I will always stand steadfast with our Jewish neighbors to root the scourge of antisemitism out of our city.”

Community WhatsApp groups in the Flatbush and Boro Park neighborhoods of Brooklyn reported finding more swastikas last Wednesday near a Jewish cemetery on McDonald Avenue; carved into the seat of a school bus for Orthodox Jewish children with special needs; and on a wall near the offices of Central Hatzalah. **HW**

# Neo-Nazis Raise Money for Georgia Man Wearing Nazi Uniform Who Allegedly Assaulted UGA Student

(JTA) – A Georgia man wearing a Nazi uniform was arrested week before last after allegedly assaulting a University of Georgia student outside a bar, in an incident that has gone viral on social media.

A noted white supremacist is taking credit for helping the alleged assailant, Kenneth Leland Morgan, make bail after several days.

The altercation, which took place outside Cutter’s Pub in downtown Athens, began after the assailant was allegedly denied entry to the bar and asked to

leave, according to UGA student newspaper Red and Black.

Morgan, who was born in 1992, was then confronted by two women outside of the bar, one of whom was Jewish, and the group got into a “yelling match” over his Nazi uniform, the victim, Grace Lang, told the Red and Black.

Lang, a 23-year-old UGA student, attempted to intervene in the confrontation and reached to rip off Morgan’s red swastika armband, after which he hit her in the face with a glass pitcher, according to video of the assault circulating on social media.

“His blatant attempt to instill fear and create outrage in the community was what sparked the issue,” Lang told the Red and Black. “I grabbed the armband, not him, to remove a hate symbol. The bar we were at doesn’t even have glass pitchers, and I have no clue where he brought it from. I didn’t see it in his hand, but he was clearly ready to use it against anyone.”

Lang sustained a broken nose and a black eye from the assault and told the Red and Black she received four stitches on her nose bridge in the emergency room.

“We are horrified by the actions of an individual who, while in downtown Athens wearing a Nazi uniform, assaulted a female University of Georgia student. The man is not a student and is not affiliated with the University,” the university said in a statement. “Members of UGA’s Student Care and Outreach team are in contact with our student who was assaulted in this off-campus incident, as well as other students who witnessed this heinous antisemitic behavior.”

Local Jewish leaders denounced the incident. “The Nazi symbol is the symbol of absolute evil. It’s the symbol of hate,” Rabbi Michael Refson, co-director of Chabad-UGA, told local media, noting that his grandmother survived Auschwitz. “It’s painful, it’s upsetting, it’s hurtful.”

Morgan was later apprehended by police and booked on suspicion of two

misdeemeanor counts of simple battery and one felony count of aggravated assault. The Athens-Clarke County Police Department did not immediately respond to an inquiry by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency about the incident.

There are signs that Morgan is becoming a cause célèbre for neo-Nazis in the United States. The white supremacist Paul Miller, who gained notoriety for making hate-filled videos while wearing Nazi garb, said on social media that he was working to secure Morgan’s release and directed followers to a crowdfunding campaign that he said was from Morgan directly.

“I am in contact with @GasChambers,” Miller tweeted last Sunday, referring to an X account that says it has raised money for. “We are going to pay the bail for Kenneth in the next few days he will be free. Gaschamber was very kind and gracious. We just spoke on the phone. We are going to get Kenneth out very soon.”

Last Monday morning, Morgan was held in the Clarke County Jail on \$1,500 bond, but by that evening, he had been removed from the jail’s online registry of inmates.

Miller said the donation campaign was needed because Morgan had lost his job over the incident. The crowdfunding campaign, on a site that bills itself as a Christian alternative to GoFundMe and is reportedly popular among extremists, has raised more than \$5,000 so far, with donors listed as “White Power,” “Joseph Goebbels” and “H3il H1tler.”

The incident is not the only recent Nazi controversy to roil the UGA campus. In January, UGA students staged a protest against the reinstatement of a professor in the engineering college, George Raymond Haynie III, who was placed on leave after allegedly hosting a neo-Nazi event on his property.

In April, after the school established an advisory committee on Jewish student life, it was awarded an “A” grade by the Anti-Defamation League for its efforts to combat campus antisemitism. **HW**

# Freed Israeli Hostage Says Captors Sexually Abused, Tortured Him

(JNS) – Recently released Israeli hostage Rom Braslavski has revealed for the first time that he was sexually abused and tortured by his captors in the Gaza Strip.

The 21-year-old was working as a security guard at the Nova music festival in southern Israel on Oct. 7, 2023. He was taken captive and held for over two years before gaining freedom last month along with the other 19 remaining living hostages as part of a U.S.-brokered ceasefire.

In excerpts of an interview with Israel’s Channel 13 News shared with The Daily Mail, Braslavski said that his Palestinian Islamic Jihad captors stripped

him naked and tied him up. “They stripped me of all my clothes – underwear, everything. They tied me up from my ... while I was completely naked. I was torn apart, dying, with no food,” he said.

“I prayed to God, “Please, save me, get me out of this already.” And you just say to yourself, ‘What the f\*\*\*?’”

He continued: “It was sexual violence – and its main purpose was to humiliate me. The goal was to crush my dignity. And that’s exactly what he did.”

“Yes. It’s hard for me to talk about that part specifically. I don’t like to talk about it. It’s hard. It was the most horrif-

ic thing,” he continued.

“It’s something even the Nazis didn’t do. During Hitler’s time, they wouldn’t have done things like this. You just pray for it to stop. And while I was there – every day, every beating – I’d say to myself, ‘I survived another day in hell. Tomorrow morning, I’ll wake up to an-

other hell. And another. And another. It doesn’t end.’”

He added: “I came back from meeting the devil.”

His mother, Tami Braslavski, said last month that he was held alone for two years, and was offered better treatment if he agreed to convert to Islam. **HW**

## Israel, India Sign Defense Pact to Boost Strategic Ties

(JNS) – Israel and India signed a new Memorandum of Understanding to expand defense, industrial and technology cooperation during high-level talks last Tuesday, the Israeli Ministry of Defense announced.

The annual meeting of the bilateral Joint Working Group was led by Israel’s Defense Ministry director general, Maj. Gen. (Res.) Amir Baram and Indian Defense Secretary Shri Rajesh Kumar Singh. As part of the visit, the Indian delegation also met Israeli Defense Minister Israel Katz and attended a forum with CEOs of Israeli defense firms focused on strengthening industrial-defense ties.

The agreement, signed by Baram and Singh, aims to deepen collaboration in defense manufacturing, research and technology, officials said.

“This strategic dialogue with India takes place at a critical juncture for both countries. Our strategic partnership is based on deep mutual trust and shared security interests,” Baram said. “We view India as a first-rate strategic partner and are determined to continue deepening cooperation in the fields of defense, technology and industry.” **HW**

# Dividend-Paying Stocks: Pros And Cons

A dividend is a portion of a company’s profit that’s paid to shareholders. That means dividend-paying stocks may provide a source of income. But they can also carry some degree of risk.

So, what do investors need to consider when it comes to dividend-paying stocks? In this Q&A, Austin Pickle, senior wealth investment solutions analyst with Wells Fargo Investment Institute, provides important information for investors to keep in mind.

### 1. What are the potential benefits of dividend-paying stocks?

“One of the big benefits is that these stocks may provide a more reliable income stream compared to some other investment options,” Pickle says.

Companies tend to issue dividends on a routine basis, such as quarterly or semi-annually, which may create a dependable income stream. Another benefit? The stocks can yield some favorable tax treatment.

“It’s going to depend on your tax situation,” Pickle says, “but in general, you may have a relatively lower tax rate for dividends compared to income gained by selling investments.” As long as the dividend-paying stock meets IRS requirements for a qualified dividend, the dividend is taxed at the lower long-term capital gains tax rate instead of being taxed as regular capital gains income. “So an investor could receive income from a dividend-paying stock without selling the stock and have a lower tax bill compared to that of a non-dividend-paying stock, which must be sold to receive income,” he says.

### 2. Who should include dividend-paying stocks in their portfolio?

Many types of investors have the potential to benefit from dividend-paying stocks. “But these stocks may be more valuable for investors who are a bit older – maybe those in retirement or close to retirement who really value a more reliable income stream,” Pickle says. “I think they’re typically beneficial from a diversification perspective, especially when interest rates are low. Dividend-paying stocks tend to have an inverse relationship with interest rates: When interest rates go down, you may see some of these dividend-paying stocks perform better.”

### 3. What are the risks associated with dividend-paying stocks?

“Firms can reduce or cancel their dividends – especially during times of economic uncertainty and times of crisis,” says Pickle. “And there’s still the risk that dividends could be cut periodically, even without the trigger of a crisis event. And if tax rates change, it could mean you’d pay more, as well.”

### Explore your options with professional advisors

Pickle stresses that investors should discuss the pros and cons of dividend-paying stocks with a financial advisor to help make sure they fill a need within an individual investment portfolio and make sense for a specific financial situation.

“You should also talk to your CPA or tax professional to make sure that you understand what the tax consequences are for your particular situation,” he advises.

Israel Meteorological Service Logs Hottest-Ever November Night in Jerusalem

(JNS) – Jerusalem last Tuesday experienced its warmest November night since the Israel Meteorological Service began keeping records in 1950, Hebrew media reported last Wednesday morning. The minimum temperature recorded overnight was 23.2 degrees Celsius (73.8 degrees Fahrenheit), according to Israel’s Channel 12 News. The previous overnight minimum record, 22.1 degrees Celsius (71.8 degrees Fahrenheit), was set in 2012. Last Monday, the 75-year-old daytime temperature record for Jerusalem was broken when the Israel Meteorological Service recorded a high of 31.8 degrees Celsius (89.2 degrees Fahrenheit) at the city’s station. The Meteorological Service added that the trend was expected to continue through Thursday and Friday, with the potential for more records to be broken. Meanwhile, rainfall remains absent across much of the Jewish state, with dryness persisting since the start of the rainy season on Oct. 1. In August, two Israelis died during a record-breaking heat wave that saw highs of approximately 49 degrees Celsius (120 degrees Fahrenheit) from the country’s north to south. **HW**

# Tucker Carlson Hosts Nick Fuentes for a Friendly Conversation About ‘These Zionist Jews’

October 29, 2025 (JTA) — Tucker Carlson wanted to know: What does Nick Fuentes actually believe?

“Everybody’s going to be like, ‘You’re a Nazi, you just like Fuentes,’” the former Fox News personality mused on his show [on Oct. 28]. “But then I’m like, ‘I don’t think Fuentes is going away. Ben Shapiro tried to strangle him in the crib in college, and now he’s bigger than ever.’”

So Carlson invited the avowed antisemite and white nationalist livestreamer onto his online talk show. There, the two had a friendly conversation about the Jews, and whether it was right to blame them for everything.

And Fuentes, whose own platform has only grown in the wake of the assassination of conservative archrival Charlie Kirk, made clear what he believes. Asked who in the conservative movement needed to be taken down, he responded, “These Zionist Jews.”

The sit-down, which had been rumored for weeks, carries implications for the growing popularity of antisemitism and anti-Israel voices on the right. Both men have followings in the millions, and Carlson has maintained close ties in President Donald Trump’s orbit even as he has become a vociferous critic of Israel and helped platform Holocaust revisionists.

Fuentes, meanwhile, has launched a far-right attack on mainstream conservatives using antisemitism as his chief plank — an ideology that an increasing number of young conservative operatives are also embracing. On YouTube, the top comments under the two-hour episode were rife with antisemitic memes.

Even as he signaled broad alignment with Fuentes’s views on Israel, Carlson gently sought to distinguish himself from his guest’s more overt antisemitism.

“I’m not that interested in ‘the Jews,’ but I am very interested in the foreign policy question,” Carlson said at one point, bringing up his fingers for air

quotes. Later, he told Fuentes, “The second you’re like, ‘Well, actually, it’s the Jews,’ first of all, it’s against my Christian faith. Like, I just don’t believe that, and I never will. Period. And second, then it becomes a way to discredit. That’s when I was like, ‘This guy’s a fed.’”

In response, the young man who opens his “America First” online shows with animated depictions of Jewish conspiracies outlined his own core belief: that “neoconservatism,” an ideology he opposes, is Jewish in nature because it prioritizes allegiance to Israel over traditional conservative principles.

“As far as the Jews are concerned, you cannot actually divorce Israel and the neocons and all those things that you talk about from Jewishness: ethnicity, religion, identity,” Fuentes told Carlson. While some Jews do oppose Israel, he acknowledged, among his enemies in conservatism, “I see Jewishness as the common denominator.”

Fuentes continued, “They’re a stateless people. They’re unassimilable. They resist assimilation for thousands of years. And I think that’s a good thing. And now they have this territory in Israel. There’s a deep religious affection for the state. It’s bound up in their identity.” Modern neoconservatism, he said, stemmed from “Jewish leftists who were mugged by reality when they saw the surprise attack in the Yom Kippur War.”

Fuentes insisted he doesn’t hate all Jews: “Not to be that guy and say that thing, but my best friend is a Jewish person,” he said, also claiming his “assistant” is Jewish (it was unclear if he was referring to the same person). He then went on to blend his understanding of Jewish American anxieties, some of which have been articulated by leading Jewish communal figures, with the dual-loyalty trope.

“If you are a Jewish person in America, it’s sort of rational self-interest, politically, to say, ‘I am a minority. I am a religious, ethnic minority. This is not really my home. My ancestral home is in Israel,’” Fuentes said. “They have this international community across borders, extremely organized, that is putting the interests of themselves before the interests of their home country.”

Even beyond Israel, Fuentes also sought to paint Judaism as incompatible with the European tradition to which America’s modern right aspires. “They hate the Romans because the Romans

destroyed the Temple,” he said. “We don’t think that, as Americans and white people.”

To hear Fuentes tell it, his radicalization was a story of first being taken in by, before later rebelling against, influential Jewish conservatives. Israel was his breaking point, he insisted.

Ben Shapiro, Mark Levin and Dennis Prager were his right-wing heroes in high school, Fuentes said; he would parrot Shapiro talking points in debates and was a member of a Facebook group for young fans of PragerU. As a college freshman in 2017 he fell into the orbit of The Daily Wire, Shapiro’s media company, after a debate against his school’s progressive student body president went viral. Fuentes would soon drop out of college to pursue conservative media full-time.

Quickly, Fuentes claimed, he became suspicious of Shapiro’s pro-Israel views. When a staffer asked him if he had any interest in traveling to Israel, he responded, “No, I think I have everything I need right here in America.... And that was a little bit of foreshadowing.”

Later, he said, he would challenge Daily Wire staff: “I would say, ‘So, why do we give Israel all this money?’” he recalled. “They would say, ‘You’re asking it in an antisemitic way.’”

But Fuentes, in his recollection, “was genuinely inquisitive. I wanted to know. Is there an actual reason?... There’s a lot of these neocon Jewish types behind the Iraq War.” The Daily Wire’s rejection of his questions on Israel, he said, spurred his shunning across the broader mainstream conservative movement and led to him going independent with his preaching of more insidious forms of Jewish control.

Comparing himself to Shapiro, Fuentes reflected, “I didn’t come from some strange background. I come from a normal home. My parents are Catholic.” (In recent weeks, Shapiro and some other voices on the right have warned of a rise in antisemitic conspiracies among their ranks.)

Even as Fuentes became a Trump loyalist in the run-up to the 2016 election, he said, he broke with conservatives by supporting President Barack Obama’s decision to abstain from, rather than back, a United Nations Security Council resolution condemning Israeli settlements in the West Bank.

“Fox News and all the pro-Israel conservatives are calling him an antisemite.

They’re saying, ‘He hates Jews! He’s an antisemite! He hates Israel!’” Fuentes recalled. “It seemed hypocritical. It seemed like how, when conservatives would critique anything about race, we got called racist. Or anything about feminism, we got called sexist. All Obama did was uphold U.S. policy on the West Bank that we’ve had since ‘67, which is, we don’t support the settlements. I said, how is it antisemitic to just be consistent on our U.S. foreign policy?”

On Israel, Carlson said, they agreed. “I always thought it’s great to criticize and question our relationship with Israel because it’s insane and it hurts us,” Carlson told him. “We get nothing out of it. I completely agree with you there.” He also blasted Christian Zionists on the right he used to support, including U.S. Ambassador to Israel Mike Huckabee, whom he said have been “seized by this brain virus.”

Later discussing the war in Gaza, Carlson added, “One of the reasons I’m mad about Gaza is because the Israeli position is, everyone who lives in Gaza is a terrorist because of how they were born, including the women and the children. That’s not a Western view. That’s an Eastern view. That’s non-Christian. That’s totally incompatible with Christianity and Western civilization. They say, ‘Oh, we’re the defenders of Western civilization.’ Not with that attitude, you’re not.”

The two did agree on some Jews they both respect, including Glenn Greenwald, an iconoclastic Israel critic formerly on the left who himself hosted Fuentes recently on his own podcast, and Paul the Apostle.

Elsewhere, the men discussed whom Fuentes wants to see be president next (he picked Ye, the superstar rapper who has embraced Nazism) and his 2022 dinner at Mar-a-Lago with Ye and Trump, where Fuentes said the once and future president said, “This guy’s hardcore. I like this guy.” (Trump has since claimed he didn’t know who Fuentes was when they dined together.)

When asked to share his unfettered core beliefs with Carlson, Fuentes obliged, painting a vision of a future America that Jews did not have the right to inherit.

“We do need to be right-wing. We do need to be Christian. We do, on some level, need to be pro-white,” he said. “Not to the exclusion of everybody else but recognizing that white people have a special heritage here, as Americans.” **HW**

# Kevin Roberts Admits ‘Mistake’ But Says Not Stepping Down at Fiery Heritage All-Staff Meeting

(JNS) — Kevin Roberts, president of the Heritage Foundation, told the conservative think tank’s staff last Wednesday morning that he would not resign amid fallout from a video he released in which he defended Tucker Carlson’s interview with Holocaust denier Nick Fuentes.

JNS obtained a recording of the confidential, in-house meeting, in which Roberts conceded that he had “made a mistake” backing Carlson in the social media video that he posted on Thursday.

“I didn’t know much about this Fuentes guy. I still don’t, which underscores the mistake,” Roberts said. “I realized in prayer and in conversations with a lot of friends and colleagues that, in fact, if I made the mess, my moral obligation is to clean it.”

Roberts also apologized for referring to Carlson’s critics as a “venomous coalition,” which he called a “terrible choice of words” and for which he apologized, recognizing that many Jews could interpret the phrase as an antise-

mitic trope.

During a question-and-answer session that lasted more than an hour, two staff members told Roberts that they no longer had confidence in his leadership. Others expressed doubts that Heritage could repair its reputation without a clear denunciation of Carlson.

Amy Swearer, a senior legal fellow at Heritage, told Roberts that many of her colleagues believed that he should resign but are afraid to say so.

“Dr. Roberts, over the last week, you have shown a stunning lack of both courage and judgment,” Swearer said. “There’s nothing ambiguous about what we saw happen. Tucker Carlson invited a Holocaust-denying neo-Nazi onto his show and then spent roughly two hours doing little more than flirting with him.”

Roberts also had many supporters among those who asked questions in the panel session, including those who supported his original video and were opposed to steps that the foundation had proposed to foster better understanding

between Christians and Jews.

“A handful of young colleagues and I had no issue with the points you made in the original video,” one unidentified female staffer said. “Gen Z has an increased unfavorable view of Israel, and it’s not because millions of Americans are antisemitic. It’s because we are Catholic and Orthodox and believe that Christian Zionism is a modern heresy.”

Evan Myers, an adviser to Roberts’s office, said that he feared that the “demand” for interns and junior staff to attend Shabbat dinners would violate his Christian faith.

“For many Christians, Friday is a special day of prayer and abstinence to commemorate the death of Christ,” Myers said. “I assume that no staff will be required to attend the Shabbat dinners, but my concern is that these dinners will serve as a sort of informal litmus test.”

Victoria Coates, a vice president and Heritage co-chair of its National Task Force to Combat Antisemitism, said that attending Shabbat dinners was a recom-

mendation and describing that as a “demand” is a “gross mischaracterization.” She added that she took “some offense” at the description.

“It was made in generosity of spirit and in the hopes of increased dialog on this issue,” Coates said. “Evan, I’m deeply sorry that you could not see that as a generous offer, but rather a personal attack on you. It was not.”


Roberts and other Heritage senior staff said that there would be no “retribution” for staffers who had spoken candidly in the meeting, even as much of the meeting was devoted to decrying leaks to the media from within the organization.

“Journalists you’re going to be leaking to will know you’re a low form of humanity,” Mike Gonzalez, a senior fellow at Heritage said. “If you speak to a journalist about this, you are probably not going to be found out, but you will know in your heart you’re a Judas, and the journalist will know who you are.” **HW**
